PROVENANCE:

A storage group set up to accommodate items regarding business, industry, banking, and money on Staten Island. Most of these materials emanate from the businesses themselves between 1824 and 1959, and were deposited at various times with the Institute, by representatives of the businesses.

SCOPE & CONTENT:

This two-cubic-foot collection is arranged alphabetically by name of business, and contains a subgroup of banking and money, also arranged alphabetically.

The subjects covered are: dyeing and dry-cleaning, brewing, fumigating, fancy paper manufacturing, silk culture, fireworks industry, gas and electric businesses, telephone, uniforms, oystering, iron mines, steel and iron manufacture, soap manufacturing, salt hay, whaling, shipbuilding, dental tools manufacturing, service laundry, telegraphy.
