



Earth Camp: Outdoor Adventures and Nature Explorations 2021-COVID-19 Guidelines

- Face coverings are required for all campers and visitors over the age of two; including at drop off and pick up. Face coverings must cover the nose, mouth and chin.
- Campers will be dropped off and picked up daily outside the side group entrance of the Staten Island Museum, Building A.
- Campers will maintain a physical distance from others not participating in Earth Camp.
- Camp registration is limited to 9 participants
- By dropping your child off daily, you are confirming that your child is in good health, does not have a temperature greater than 100.4 degrees, has not been exposed to COVID-19 and is not exhibiting any symptoms associated with COVID-19.
- Campers should stay home if they feel ill in any way.
- Campers will practice scheduled hand hygiene by washing with soap and water:
 - Upon arrival
 - Between program activities
 - After using the restroom
 - Before eating lunch/snacks
 - Before departure from day's activities
- Hand sanitizer will be provided for daily use and can be found throughout the building.
- Sharing of STEAM activity supplies will be limited as much as possible.
- Campers will use designated restrooms and adhere to occupancy limits
- Increased cleaning and disinfecting protocols are in place; the museum is taking all steps to reduce the risk of exposure to COVID-19
- To help reduce the risk of exposure to COVID-19 the HVAC system in the building filters the air with MERV-13 filters and runs the Air Handling Units (AHU) more frequently. Additionally, the public spaces are kept at 45% humidity
- Camp staff will be trained on health and safety guidelines including COVID-19 protocols.
- Camp staff will complete daily health screening assessment prior to reporting to work and will stay home if unwell.
- Earth Camp will take place on the grounds of Snug Harbor Cultural Center, on walking trips to nearby green spaces, as well as inside the museum building.

Please be assured that the museum's comprehensive health and safety guidelines follow current Center for Disease Control (CDC), New York State, and New York City recommendations. We will continue to monitor any changes in COVID-19 health and safety protocols and make adjustments when required.
